The Alaskan Spirit of Giving

On April 11, Kinross Fort Knox, Sumitomo Metal Mining Pogo and Usibelli Coal Mine each presented the GHCF with \$10,000 to kick off the four-year matching challenge grant from the Rasmuson Foundation. This matching grant will help us grow our endowment for the purpose of helping to enrich the lives of Interior Alaskans.

To receive the Rasmuson Foundation grant, GHCF must receive \$185,000 in donations from individuals and businesses over the next four years. After we reach our goal, the Rasmuson Foundation will match that dollar for dollar! In 2017, we hope to reach \$90,000 in donations. Thanks to our local mines and some generous donors in the community, we are off to a great start! We have already received \$45,000 in gifts this year! Our mission is being realized and our communities are being strengthened and supported



with the help of our donors. It is inspiring to see this generosity and it fills us with confidence that our friends and neighbors will be moved by the same spirit and pride as Fort Knox, Pogo and Usibelli and will also make a contribution to our endowment. Together, we can and will strengthen, support and enhance the communities of Interior Alaska now and for generations to come.

Grantee Highlight - The Bread Line

Bread Line's Stones Throw culinary job training program teaches students more than just how to prepare a meal. One recent graduate who had been born with drugs in her system and was never given a chance is on her way to independence with a sense of value that will be her strength to remain selfsufficient. In just 12 ¹/₂ short weeks Stone's Throw's students learn life skills such as reading, math and interpersonal interaction, as well as culinary technical skills and food safety training. The graduates of Stone's Throw learn to



conquer their fears and build confidence. They leave the program as a trained labor pool for the local hospitality industry. Bread Line Inc.'s Executive Director, Ed Bermudez and Stone's Throw Program Manager, Chef Danielle Flaherty are committed to the success of this program and to all the students enrolled in Stone's Throw.

Grantee Highlight Alaska Avalanche Information Center

Alaska ranks number one per capita in avalanche deaths in the nation but does not have a state supported snow safety program. The Alaska Avalanche Information Center (AAIC) was formed in 2008 by a group of dedicated citizens with a mission to educate the public about avalanche awareness and safety. The Eastern Alaska Regional Center began in 2015 when Alaska High School Coach Erik Peterson died in an avalanche near Black Rapids Lodge.

AAIC supports safety education, awareness and emergency response in the Interior through several groups including the Fairbanks Avalanche Center. Because of generous donations to the GHCF, the Fairbanks Avalanche Center was awarded \$750 for an avalanche airbag, beacon, shovel and probe. This equipment will be used to assist in education, training, and emergency and rescue responses to avalanche activities. Thank you AAIC for all the work you do to make living and playing in Alaska safer!

Starts September 1st and ends October 14th at 5pm. the GHCF seeks applicants from qualified tax-exempt 501(c)(3) organizations (or equivalent organizations) in the greater Fairbanks area that serve the needs such as health, education, community heritage, the arts, vulnerable populations, animal welfare, recreation, safety, and community and economic development. 
